I am writing you today to talk about our First Suburbs Consortium of Southwest Ohio (FSC-SWO). We work to bring together local mayors, trustees, council members, and administrators of the 48 jurisdictions in Hamilton County. We are active advocates for the interests of "inner-ring suburbs" within local, county, and state government.

No matter our location or economic status, we all share the same concerns of aging infrastructure and housing stock, and project funding, among others. I cordially invite you and your community to join us as a member of FSC-SWO and to work together with our other member communities to make a difference.

Our quarterly meetings bring dozens of elected officials together for timely, topical dialogue with county officials, state office holders, and leaders from regional entities like the Metropolitan Sewer District. We have also supported several federal funding programs for blight removal, business restoration, and economic development and in earning our fair share of the already-appropriated money that would help our communities. At the state level, we have engaged with the tax changes, loss of the Local Government Fund levels and other alterations that impacted our funding. Additionally, in 2022, we partnered with Soapbox Media and a coalition of stakeholders for the First Suburbs - Beyond Borders series to highlight first suburbs communities. We are excited to announce we will be continuing our partnership with Soapbox Media in 2024. Your contribution to the FSC-SWO helps fund this endeavor.

I know we all struggle to identify the programs that bring our communities the most value. FSC works hard to keep our membership dues at \$200 per year. This will enable you to stay "in the loop" with us as we deal with state, federal, and local influences which impact on our future and that of our residents.
