Good Morning,

I am writing you today to talk about our First Suburbs Consortium of Southwest Ohio (FSC). We work to bring together local mayors, trustees, council members and administrators of the 42 jurisdictions in Hamilton County. We are active advocates for the interests of "inner-ring suburbs" within local, county and state government.

No matter our location or economic status, we all share the same concerns of aging infrastructure and housing stock, and project funding, among others. I cordially invite you and your community to join us as a member of FSC and to work together with our other member communities to make a difference.

Our quarterly meetings bring dozens of elected officials together for timely, topical dialogue with county officials, state office holders, and leaders from regional entities like the Metropolitan Sewer District. It was the "sticker shock" of \$3,200 fees per residence as a possible future price of MSD sewer service that galvanized members at our recent meeting. Our members will play an active role in MSD governance when the system comes under county/city governance by 2018.

We have also supported several federal funding programs for blight removal, business restoration and economic development and in earning our fair share of the already-appropriated money that would help our communities. At the state level we have engaged with the tax changes, loss of the Local Government Fund levels and other alterations that impacted our funding.

I know we all struggle to identify the programs that bring our communities the most value. FSC works hard to keep our membership dues at \$200 per year. This will enable you to stay "in the loop" with us as we deal with state, federal and local influences which impact on our future and that of our residents.

You will find attached an invoice, and I urge you to please join with us to make our suburban communities stronger and better funded. As one member of our executive committee said, "Let's Not Leave Any More Grant Money on the Table!" I look forward to your questions or comments on our 2016 lists of priority projects. Thanks in advance for your leadership!
